**This policy addresses issues in relation to:
Safe and supportive environment – Student Welfare 3.6.2**

The School's policies, which are made from time to time, are made pursuant to the registration requirements set out in section 47 of the NSW Education Act and the Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards.

PURPOSE

International Football School believes in a No Homework Policy. Students will not be issued with extra work in addition to what they have already been asked to complete. International Football School supports home learning program that is student motivated and is a tool used for extending effective learning time, developing good work habits and self discipline, and encourage parents to become involved in their child's education.

PROCEDURE

Our No Homework Policy allows for students to

- Catch up on missed work due to illness/outside of classroom activity without the pressure of "added" work

- Develop initiative and recognise areas that need improvement

- Development independent skills in time management in regards to their own study timetable outside of the classroom

- Allows students to focus on developing skills and content knowledge

- Engage in activities such as learning an instrument, alternate sport, or part time employment outside of school hours.

Students in Year 11 and 12

International Football School understands the academic demands of the HSC Course. At times, out of class tasks may be set by the subject teacher in order to consolidate in class learning. Academic success and extra study outside of class time is encouraged in order for students to achieve their desired results.

Stage 6 teachers will consult with each other in connection to issuing out of class tasks to ensure students are not overloaded or the demands unreasonable.
